

Whether you are a keen gardener or love to explore gardens – or both – visiting a National Garden Scheme garden ticks all the boxes. Here in the beautiful county of Sussex we have a rich and varied choice of more than 200 gardens opening for us in 2024.

And there is truly something for everybody from the compact town gardens (but often filled to the brim with plants) to the rolling acres of landscaped country gardens and everything in between including community gardens and vineyards. There are many gardens that welcome families and children, allow dogs, have wheelchair access, open by arrangement for groups (see page 8), have an NGS open day, and pretty much everyone lays on the refreshments and cakes that the NGS is renowned for. For many gardens you can now book your tickets online via the NGS website and a number of gardens also offer cashless payment on the day.

Of course opening your garden for the NGS or being a visitor is the way we raise extraordinary amounts of funding for our beneficiary charities (see opposite). Our Sussex gardens contributed nearly £300,000 of this.

Our county booklets are printed at the start of the year to give you all the details from snowdrop gardens opening in January and February to autumnal gardens opening in October. The information here is correct as we go to press but do always check on the NGS website **ngs.org.uk** for updates, there is also an NGS app for your smartphone and you can scan the QR code here which takes you directly to Sussex gardens.
